The State of Children's Development – Locally & Provincially

Kirsten Deasey, Early Learning Teacher, provided an interesting presentation on early childhood development. At birth a full-term baby's organs and brain

structure are fully developed, but the brain's circuitry continues to develop long after birth. During the first few years of life, this development takes place at an incredible rate, with the brain tripling in size by the time a child reaches three years of age.

One of the most dramatic discoveries in molecular biology over the past generation involves the interplay between early experiences and environments that impacts how, where and when genes work. Most brain scientists no longer consider "nature versus nurture," but instead focus on the effects of both nature and nurture. Brain development is not determined solely by either genes or the environment, but rather through an interaction between the two.

According to Human Early Learning Partnership University of British Columbia, only 71% of BC children arrive at kindergarten meeting all of the developmental benchmarks they need to thrive both now and into the future.

Kirsten reported on Sunshine Coast and Powell River Schools District EDI (Early Development Instrument) report that indicates the percent of children vulnerable on one or more scales of the EDI in 2009/2010 (categories include social, physical, communication, language and emotion).

Trustee Variance...

The Board passed a motion to explore the options of reducing the number of trustees from seven to five and changing electoral areas, including an "elected-at-large" model. A public meeting will be scheduled to receive public input on this.

In October, 2002 the Board of School Trustees also requested a variance of the trustee electoral boundaries in School District No. 46 (Sunshine Coast). This request supported the wishes of the Sechelt Indian Government District. As outlined in the letter received from the Minister of Education, he chose "not to exercise [his] jurisdiction under Section 30(4) of the School Act to vary the trustee electoral areas in School District No. 46 (Sunshine Coast)."
