**Secondary Numeracy Assessments**

**Background**

From Suzanne Hoffman, Superintendent of Learning Transformation:

“As you are aware, the new graduation numeracy assessment is scheduled to proceed in January 2018. The Ministry wants to ensure a successful implementation and this letter confirms the approach and next steps.”

We are initiating a managed implementation involving a subset of students writing in January 2018. This approach has been informed by the numeracy trial completed in April 2017, by sector feedback, and aligns with common practice for implementation of large scale changes. All remaining students will have the opportunity to write in June and August 2018, or in a subsequent school year.
