What's happened to date



Provincial advisory group, composed of senior representatives from 10 partner organizations



More than 50 partner meetings, which involved more than 1,000 individuals



Opportunity for all districts to provide feedback on draft framework prior to development of detailed policy document

Framework for Enhancing Student Learning

System-wide focus on career, human, social, and intellectual development

Multi-year district and school plans

Updated annually

Meaningful and effective evidence

Reported at least annually by districts and the province

System-wide capacity building

Team-based supports focused on continuous improvement

Linkages with existing local agreements to ensure consistent and meaningful support of Aboriginal students (e.g., Aboriginal Education Enhancement Agreements)




