- 3. Mental Health continues to be of big discussion in the District. Conference in May coming up. They are asking for REPs for student voice.
- 4. Ministry working on safe healthy and welcoming schools. SOGI 123 Our District one of first Districts to bring in.
- 5. Ministry also working on Playground Initiative. Playground improvement.
- 6. Circle of Care for students. Smaller groups to help Kindergarten students in Transition.
- 7. Family Resource centers opened in 5 locations. Each location offering support. Strong Start Programs.
- 8. Programming Goals: Train in Trades, cook and auto.
- 9. BCTF and Ministry and thru our Board in negotiations. In mediation now. Strike option currently uknown.

Healthy Schools Committee

Healthy Schools Committee

Local Action Team for children meets monthly. Kate Kerr Chairs Healthy Schools Committee.

- A. Application for this went through when Vanessa White was here. Proposals with Pathways to Care. To be used as a navigation tool. Resembles spectrum of care services available on the Sunshine Coast.
- B. Our expression of Interest has been accepted for a Health Literacy Project with Children's Hospital. The focus is working together to improve the Mental Health and Wellness in our School Community. The first meeting with their Representatives will occur Sept.27,201
- C. Given that our McCreary and MDI data indicate rising levels of self-reported anxiety and depression among our youth we are looking at potentially utilizing the "Pathways to Care" document developed by the CYMHSU Local Action Team. This tool was designed to help families navigate health services, as well as to help identify gaps. In addition, expanding initiatives started last year through school gardens and bringing nature into the classroom are to be explored.
- D. The next healthy schools committee meeting is October 8,2019 and will include discussion on proposed regulation revision re: Head Lice as well as Food in our Schools.
- E. There is a huge staffing problem with availability of counselling services. Its not a budgetary issue, it's a recruitment issue.
- F. Jill Shatford Parent in Residence for Family Smart is going on temporary leave until March 2020 Lots of information on Family Smart Website to assist families.

Planning for Gr7 school panels on Cannabis/Substance Use is underway and will likely be scheduled starting January 2020. Discussions continue around meeting the needs of high school students. Trying to initiate more programs with peer support.

Perhaps panels for high school students with strong student voice. Looking for people to come forward with any ideas around more peer support. Needs brought to attention: Youth outreach needing more attention. Including more beds for youth in psychiatric care in the hospital.

Stay tuned at your schools for other new programming such as the lunch time drop-in at GES and KES. Discussion has centered on several wide-ranging topics including specific needs for expanding youth outreach coverage, hospital emergency care, poverty, housing needs, waitlists, rehab and cost for families.
