1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 pm.

Chair Ruth acknowledged that the meeting was taking place on the unceded territories of the Sechelt and Squamish Nations. Due to COVID restrictions, the meeting was attended by trustees and staff only, with some trustees attending via video conference. The meeting was live-streamed to the district's YouTube channel to enable public participation.

Superintendent Bocking shared a compilation of pictures of students and staff during the recent return to school.

6. Reports

a. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Bocking reported on:

- Students are returning to school, thriving in an environment of kindness, and adapting to changes implemented due to the pandemic,
- Option 2 transition phase students are being asked to determine their intention to continue the school year either in-class or on-line learning by November 9th,
- StrongStart programs continue to take place outside with a registered attendance in place,
- The district participated in Orange Shirt day on September 30th,
- Several university virtual events are scheduled for secondary students.
- The district recognized teachers on World Teachers Day,
- Staff participated in the first of four professional development session with Shelley Moore to support inclusive education,
- Vancouver Coastal Health and School District No. 46 hosted a virtual Town Hall live on Facebook,
- Exposures at schools within Vancouver Coastal Health's regional area (Vancouver, Richmond, North and West Vancouver and along the Sea-to-Sky Highway, Sunshine Coast and BC's Central Coast) are being reported to their website,
- Schools participated in "Active Transportation Week".

Superintendent Bocking shared three short poems from the recent Coastal Voices anthology of student writing. Special thanks went out to Jane Davidson and John Lussier for their continuing work in compiling and publishing the anthology.

b. Strategic Plan Reports

1. Goal 1.c. - Core Competencies

Director Kerr reported on:

- The connection between core competencies and the first people's principals of learning.
- Ways in which younger students are prompted to reflect on their own core competencies.
- The integration of core competencies in competency based individual education plans (CB-IEP).

2. Goal 1.k. - Fine Arts

Superintendent Bocking spoke to his written report and indicated that the district Fine Arts committee will develop a plan for implementation. Additional reports will follow as the year progresses.

Goal 3.c. - Collaboration and Partnerships

Director Kerr reported on the district's involvement in the intergovernmental local action team that supports children and youth.

- c. Administrative Regulations in Circulation:
 - 1. Reg 2140 Visual Identity: Circulating until Dec. 23, 2020

The regulation is entering the circulation phase and was reviewed by the Committee of the Whole at the meeting taking place on September 22nd.

1. Enrollment Report

The board reviewed early enrollment numbers. The shift in educational practices for the 2020-21 school year has resulted in a net decrease in funding of approximately \$1,000,000 at "brick & mortar" schools as a result of the online learning option. The Sunshine Coast Online program, operated by SPIDER, generated additional funding and added staffing to address in increased demand.

A number of schools have seen enrollment shifts and are not being asked to reorganize classes or adjust staffing. This has resulted in the need to provide schools with supplemental funding in order to support the existing staffing levels.

2. Federal Funding and Unrestricted Surplus

Secretary-Treasurer Weswick reported on the consultation process for the federal Safe Return to School funding and reported on the plan, in which the cleaning and custodial supplement, outdoor learning facilities, and school enrollment decline funding constitute the largest line items.

Trustees requested an opportunity to discuss the plan in detail at an upcoming meeting and to address recent requests from PACs for additional support for food programs.

The board agreed to consider the recommended motion in order to distribute funds to schools in a timely manner.

7. Questions and Enquiries from the Public Relating to the Board Meeting

A member of the public asked if there the school district was continuing to do business with Old Republic given that the company has not yet refunded families for trips canceled due to the pandemic. Superintendent Bocking responded that the district is no longer connected with the company.

A member of the public asked if the board would consider live-streaming meetings to Facebook in order to increase viewership. Chair Ruth reported that the board is considering all opportunities and will look at the pros and cons of live-streaming to Facebook.

A member of the public asked if the district had considered any changes to transportation for courtesy riders residing inside the Langdale Elementary walk limit. Secretary-Treasurer Weswick responded that the district had loosened restrictions where it could be done in a safe way, without increasing risk to eligible riders.

A member of the public asked, in regards to enrollment changes, if higher enrolment in the online learning program resulted in lower staffing levels overall. Superintendent Bocking indicated that staffing at schools is being maintained at the present time.

A member of the press asked for an update on the status of the civil claim against the topsoil company. Secretary-Treasurer Weswick indicated that the claim is pending.

A member of the press asked what "transportations improvements" referred to in the Federal Safe Return Funding plan and which sites were selected for outdoor facilities. Secretary-Treasurer Weswick reported that funds were intended to provide an additional bus and driver, and that the location of outdoor learning facilities had not yet been determined.

A member of the public asked if additional funds would be allocated to schools that have a principal teaching in multiple classrooms in order to limit exposure between cohorts. Superintendent Bocking responded that safety protocols are in place to limit exposure and that funding was determined by principals in consultation with finance.
