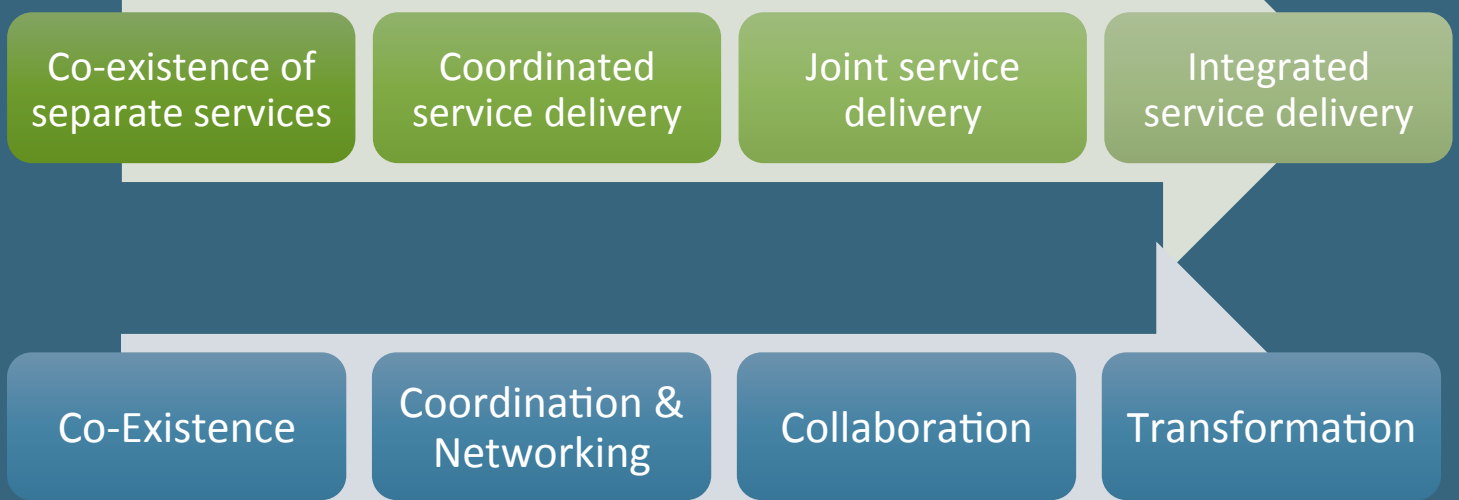

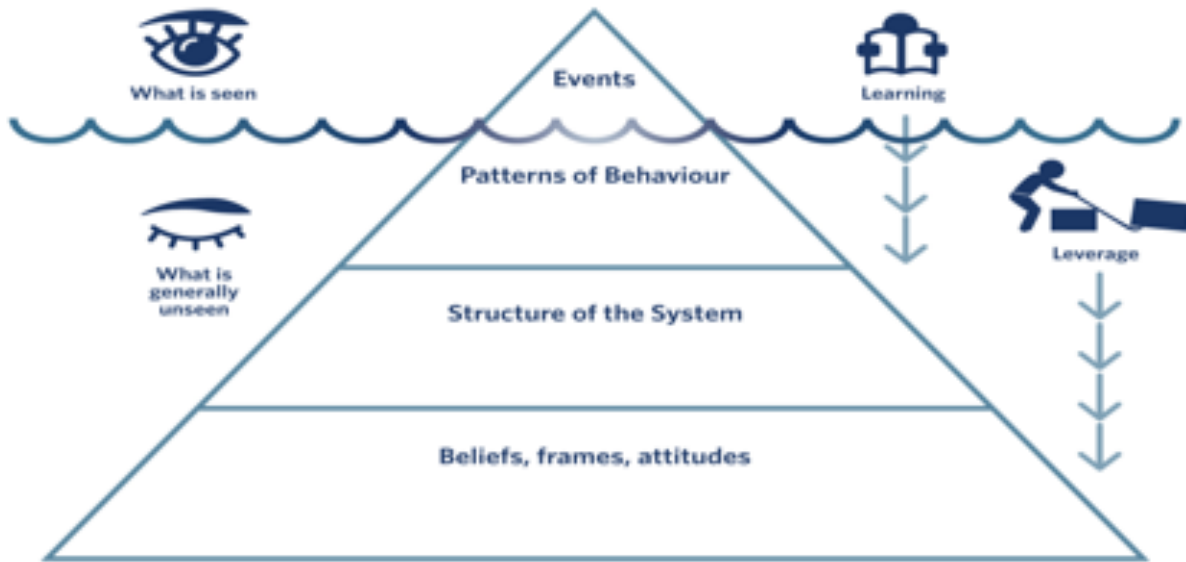

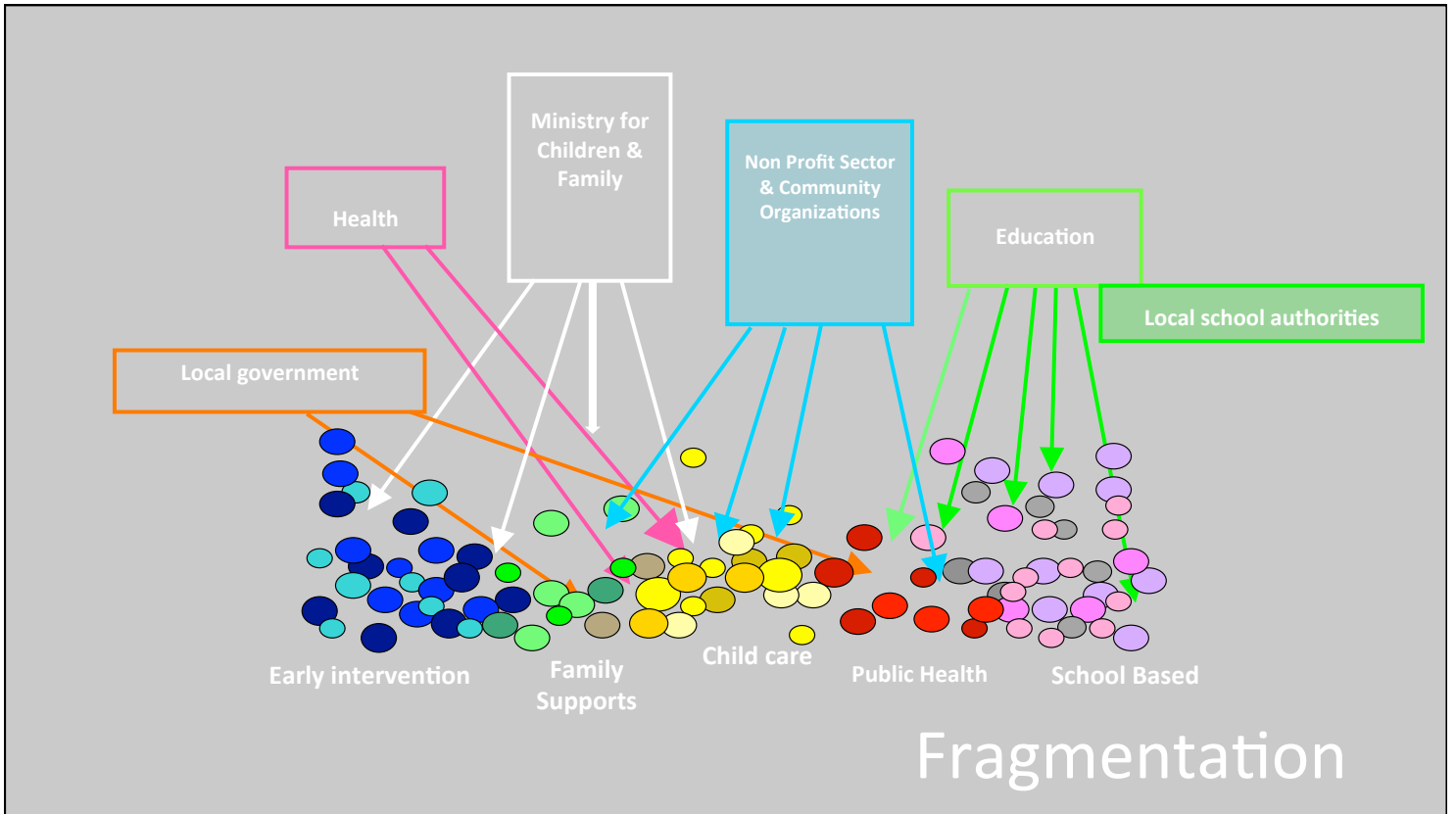

In addition to various fundraising efforts at schools and considerable donations for student bursaries, the school district has received cash and gifts totaling \$115,000 during the 2015/16 school year in targeted charitable contributions.
