7:05 -7:45 PM Guest Speaker: Ray Clayton, District Inclusion Support Coordinator from the Inclusion Support Services, about student engagement, attendance, and how families can support.

- -Level of Intervention from 1-4, 3,4 is Universal Supports, and 1,2 are the intensive intervention, online learning and special support.
- -Inclusion Support intervention model for instance, a mental health crisis, School school-based team gathers the information and finds a prevention plan and a safe adult in the school while students go through their mental health.
- -Strategies like less social media, screen time, and better sleep are key for parents can assist.
- -PE once or twice and music only a few times a week, can school provide more for kids?
- -Every student is unique. The grade 7 to high school transition is huge pressure.
- -Anxiety is the number one cause of absenteeism. Instructors change every classroom.
- -Feeling connected with one adult in the building is important. It takes time for them to feel safe. The feeling of connection and care by adults in the school is a number one

identifier.

- -Absenteeism became a global problem at the staff and student level.
- -Counsellor, mental health curriculum class, collaborative approach are taken.
- -The future presentation will be scheduled to dive in deeper on this topic.
