## COMPASSIONATE SYSTEMS LEADERSHIP

For the past two years, the
Sunshine Coast School District
trustees and staff have been
working with Provincial trainers
and learning more about this
model of leadership. In late May
DPAC and Sunshine Coast
Schools' parents and caregivers
gathered for a working session
on 'how to start the school year
in a good way' through a
Compassionate Systems
Leadership lens with facilitator
Caroline Picard. It was a lovely
night of connection and growth.

## TRUSTEE SCHOOL TOURS

Another highlight of the trustees' school year is the school tours. On June 3 we had the opportunity to visit the last of the school sites on our four-day tour schedule this Spring. These annual trustee school visits provide a wonderful opportunity for recognition, appreciation, and support for the outstanding work happening in SD46 schools and departments.

#### **GRADUATION**

Grade 12 students from Chatelech, Elphinstone, Pender Harbour and Sunshine Coast Alternative school will be graduating at the end of June. This cohort of students is remarkable in many ways, not least because their first year of high school life was interrupted by the Covid 19 pandemic. In March 2020, Sunshine Coast schools did not open after spring break as a Provincial state of emergency had begun. Schools were opened for children of essential workers in early April, then on June 1 all students were welcomed back for part-time in class sessions. Our 2024 graduates learned to adapt, demonstrated resilience, and they offer us a vision of hope for the future. We will be attending the Sunshine Coast secondary schools graduation ceremonies to celebrate our 2024 graduating classes.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

The Board of Education has adopted the following Theory of Action, recommended by the Strategic Plan Writing Team, as the aspirational student learning goal:

"We believe that when we create authentic and inclusive learning environments, then we will enhance each student's development of the core competencies overtime."

The Board has also agreed to move forward with the nine strategies recommended in the Writing Team's report.

To support our discussions of the new Strategic Plan around the board table, we have been using the metaphor of a canoe journey with many paddlers; we look forward to welcoming everyone back to school in September and to embarking upon the 2024-2025 journey with new paddlers and the renewed energy of the 2024-2029 strategic plan.

SECHELT ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL BUILDING - SEISMIC RETROFIT TO ENHANCE EARTHQUAKE RESILIENCE.

CEDAR GROVE ELEMENTARY - CHILDCARE FACILITY AT CEDAR GROVE ELEMENTARY TO PROVIDE ESSENTIAL SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY.
