
GARBAGE BAGS

46% of waste taking up space in our landfill could have been recycled or processed into compost.


LANDFILL CAPACITY

It is estimated that the region's only solid waste disposal site, Sechelt Landfill, will be at capacity by mid-2026.



WASTE PER PERSON

The SCRD currently produces 421 kg of waste per person each year. The provincial target is 350 kg.

WASTE REDUCTION STRATEGY

Our district is transitioning to centralized hallway compost/recycling/garbage stations, and removing most classroom garbage cans. Portables and some specialty areas within schools will have smaller waste stations added.
