Background:

School District 46 is a leader in student voice. The Board is proud to be welcoming its seventh student trustee to the table tonight! The District Student Leadership Team (DSLTT) meets monthly with the Superintendent, Principals and Vice Principals to review matters of importance to students. Much of the DSLTT work has been about connections amongst schools and learning from each other. Our principals ensure that there are a variety of different student voice structures in their schools. The former Board has enhanced student voice through BCSTA motions that have motivated improvement across the province. While the district is proud of its role in supporting student voice in our communities and in the province, there is room for continued growth.

Discussion:

Student Voice means that those most directly impacted by the work of our district have a say in what happens in their education. For most of us, our personal experience in schools is some time ago. Technology, social structures, educational research and much more are changing the way we interact, learn and problem solve. The expectations on students are different and their future is still being created. It is our obligation to know where students are in their understandings and beliefs in the system and to capture their new ideas for an educational system that they fully embrace as their own.
