Technology plan – on the website: Tech.sd46.bc.ca

- Network infrastructure, storage of files, etc. Backbone of the system and enables everything else.
- Computer hardware projectors, laptops, ipads, etc. Constant changes
 - o All elementary schools have at least on laptop cart
 - o All secondary have more due
- Robotics and coding is emerging and becoming more important
- Educational Software:
 - o ERAC digital bundle for students
 - Microsoft office
- Training and Support
 - Example: Teachers Educators Technology Teaching (TETT)
 - Teachers have an ipad and work with colleagues to support teachers and their students.
 - SNAP and Read: program gives a simplified version if needed in a text.
 - Co-Writer: co-habitats with snap and read: writes information, gives suggestions for words, etc.

 - Discussed and demonstrated the app that enables much information to be shared from the school to students, parents.
